What Must I Do To Be Saved?

In Matthew 19:16, a rich, young man comes to Jesus and wants to know what he must do in inherit eternal life. Jesus responds by telling him 6 of the 10 commandments. In v.20, the young man tells Jesus that he has kept these things since his youth. You can actually see this young man swell with pride as he asks Jesus: "what do I lack?" In v.21, Jesus tells the young man to sell all of his possessions and give them to the poor and for him to take up his cross and follow after Jesus. The next verse tells us that the young man walked away sorrowfully because he had many possessions.

In Acts 2, a crowd of Jews are listening to the apostles preach the first gospel sermon on the day of Pentecost. After being convinced that they were guilty of killing Jesus, they ask the apostles in v.37 what they had to do to be saved. Peter's response is recorded in v.38. They were told to repent and to be baptized for the remission of sins. In v.21, we are told that 3,000 of them listened to Peter and obeyed the gospel.

What was the difference between the two situations? One party was willing to do whatever was required in order to be saved and the other party was not. The first difference we need to notice was in the case of the rich, young ruler. He was not given the same answer as the people on the day of Pentecost because the Old Law was still in effect (Hebrews 9:16-17). Therefore, baptism for the remission of sins was not required. The second difference is found in the attitude of this young man. He did not really want to know what he lacked. He wanted a slap on the back.

However, the crowd on the day of Pentecost was sincere. They truly were convicted of their sins and wanted to receive forgiveness from them. When they asked the apostles the question, they were ready to accept whatever answer the apostles were going to give them. This must be our attitude. Many ask the question: "what must I do to be saved", but they do not want the answer. They want to be patted on the back and told that they are alright. This is the reason so many get offended when the truth concerning salvation is preached. Which of these attitudes describe you? Are you willing to do whatever is required of you to be saved? I sure hope you are. If you have not obeyed the gospel, I pray that you will make the same decision that 3,000 others did on the day of Pentecost and be baptized for the remission of sins. May we strive every day to be as faithful to the Lord as we should be.


