As Christians, we talk a lot about how powerful prayer is in our lives, but then we don't bother to use that powerful tool. We need to pray when everything is going right – giving God the thanks – not just when we're in trouble. He asks for our burdens, but likes to hear us pray "thank you" every now and then.
