

Let God Be Magnified.

What a grand and glorious thought – *Let God Be Magnified!* That is the thought delivered by David in Psalms 70.

"Make haste, O God, to deliver me; make haste to help me, O LORD. Let them be ashamed and confounded that seek after my soul: let them be turned backward, and put to confusion, that desire my hurt. Let them be turned back for a reward of their shame that say, Aha, aha. Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee: and let such as love thy salvation say continually, Let God be magnified. But I am poor and needy: make haste unto me, O God: thou art my help and my deliverer; O LORD, make no tarrying." (KJV)

This is a psalm (repeated in the last verses of Psalms 40) seemingly written to seek God's help in dealing with those who wish to harm him and commending those who seek God and love the salvation that only God offers.

Put yourself in David's place. Here is someone who was a *"man after God's own heart;"* a man who knew God almost on a personal level; a man who could confidently call on God for his salvation and blessings. Can we do that? I believe we can. Maybe not in that same manner as David. We're living in different times and certainly under a different Law than David did.

Just as David said in this Psalm, Let Us Magnify God!
