## My Name Is Ruth

My name is Ruth. As a young girl, I was raised in the country of Moab. Little did I know what would lye ahead for me. Little did I know that I would play a role in the lineage of the Savior.

During the time of the judges when there was a famine, an Israelite family from Bethlehem – Elimelech, his wife Naomi, and their sons Mahlon and Chilion – emigrated to my country. Elimelech died, and Mahlon married Ruth and Chilion married Orpah.

After about ten years, Mahlon and Chillion also died in Moab. Naomi decided to return to Bethlehem. She told Orpah and me to return to our own mothers and remarry. Orpah reluctantly left; however, I loved Naomi and did not want to leave her. I told her, "Do not urge me to leave you, to turn back and not follow you.
